Digital Reference Maps



Directions from Honolulu via Likelike Highway

1. Take Likelike Highway (Hwy 63); *after the Wilson Tunnel*, get in the right lane and turn off onto Kahakili Highway (Hwy 83).
2. Drive about 9.5 miles. (you'll be going north, on the blue line on the map). The park will be on your right.



Directions from Honolulu via Pali Highway

1. Take Pali Highway (Hwy 61); *after the Pali Tunnels*, get in the left lane and turn left onto Kamehameha Highway (Hwy 83).
2. Drive about 2 miles until Kamehameha (Hwy 83, the green line on the map) crosses the Likelike Highway, at which point the route number changes to 830.
3. Continue on Kamehameha (now Hwy 830, still on the green line on the map) for 5 miles, where it merges with Kahakili Highway and again becomes Hwy 83.
4. Drive about 4.5 miles (you'll be going north, now on the blue line on the map). The park will be on your right.

The Park

Turn into the park, look for first parking lot on the left (there is a mini-traffic circle to be circumnavigated). Looking out toward the water and Chinamen's Hat (Mokolii Island), there will be a permanent rest room building. The KARC area is to the right of that (across the wide grass area between the parking area and the water). Field Day vehicles are usually roughly in the middle of the large parking lot (looking back toward the mountain). **The talk-in frequency is 146.52 MHz simplex if you need guidance when approaching the park and the Field Day site.**
